Learn the facts about cervical cancer

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is the main cause of cervical cancer

HPV is a common virus that is passed from one person to another during sex - using condoms can reduce your risk

.

Women who smoke are about 2x more likely to be diagnosed with cervical cancer

There are two screening tests, a **Pap test and an HPV test**

Get your first Pap test when you are 21

At age 30 you can have a Pap test, an HPV test, or both

If you have had a hysterectomy, ask your doctor about cervical cancer screening. If the cervix was not removed, you still need to be screened!

Talk with your doctor about your cervical cancer risk, and what screening plan is right for you.
